#### School day - setting children up for success

Please ensure children are at school on time to begin the school day before the 8.30am bell, as being on time sets them up for a calm start. Late arrival/late entry to class can be unsettling for all students and needs to be avoided unless absolutely necessary. Morning transition and settling is an integral part of each day of learning. Should late arrival be unavoidable, parents/carers must accompany their child to the office to sign them in. Thank you for your support ensuring learning time is optimised and all efforts to ensure appropriate morning routines are in place.

#### National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) dates for 2017

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN), an annual Australia-wide assessment for all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will occur on 9, 10 & 11 May this year. Students in these year levels will participate in tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. #### Visit by NASA Scientist, Street Science Incursion and Afternoon Science Extension Program at St Martin's

Last week, the school had a special visit from Carmel Johnston who has recently completed a mission with NASA exploring the possibility of life on Mars. Carmel was a commander of the 'Hawaiian Space Exploration Analog and Simulation Mission'. She spent a year in the cramped quarters of an 80m2 building replicating life on Mars. The data gained from this experiment was primarily concerned with investigating how people cope in isolation, extreme and confined environments (that of what the Martian first fleeters would be faced with upon arrival). The students enjoyed learning new information from Carmel and particularly enjoyed asking her about her experiences with NASA.

This week, our Year 5 students enjoyed some rich learning experiences as part of the Street Science program. Next term, the school is planning to introduce an afternoon Science extension program run by Science

#### CONCEPTS (Term 2)

**1. Catchment Care** - The quality and quantity of the water we drink and the food we eat depend on the condition of the catchment area in which we live. Catchment health is, important but there will always be conflicting demands on natural resources.

**2**. **Buried Treasure** - There are thousands of different crystals, everything from salt to diamonds. Grow the crystals of your choice for fun and enter them for judging in the crystal growing competition - if you dare!

3. What a Muddle - The application of organized tests, based on the physical and chemical

**<u>Reading Magic</u>** – This information from Mem Fox outlines the importance of reading each day.

Mem Fox loves to remind us that learning to read is 'magical'. We call upon our knowledge and understanding of a great store of vocabulary that we have heard and we match it to the context of a story in order to get the author's intended meaning.

When we, as adults, read aloud to children they gain a vast amount of general knowledge. They listen to the richness of language from books they cannot yet read. They hear the rhythm of words; the emotion of the story; all the things the author intended. If we keep reading aloud to children they will continue to be immersed in a world of words that they will eventually meet when they themselves are independent readers. Keep night time reading alive!

#### Project Compassion - How are we going?

On Monday's Assembly, I spoke to the students about the rife poverty in Fiji, and we watched a video which showed exactly where our donations will go. A number of students have visited Fiji, and there was a hush of silence as they were able to see the difference between "resort Fiji" and the reality of life in a squatter settlement. #### **DIGINITY BASKET**

Each Friday during Lent a group of mums have been meeting for prayer and discussion. In our first meeting we talked of the three pillars of Lent (prayer, fasting and almsgiving), and how to make them real. The idea of a dignity basket – *an offering of personal or hygiene items for women in refuge or crisis situations emergency* – was raised. We have commenced a small collection.

Though we are to care for the poor every day of our Christian lives, on Holy Thursday this profoundly Christian calling is emphasized by the collection for the poor, which is part of the Mass. Items for this Dignity Basket, collected throughout Lent, will be donated to the Romero Centre. The Romero Centre at Dutton Park is run by Mercy Community Services, and provides support to refugees and asylum seekers.

# **SPORTS NEWS**

#### Cross Country Carnival 2017

Please keep Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> March 2017 open in your calendars. The St Martin's School Cross Country will be held on this dav.

#### Championship Race

The championship race is between 1.5-3km depending on age and is now open to those children wishing to trial for the District Cross Country Team (10-12yrs) and St Anthony's Cross Country (9-12yrs), those who are 9 years old and over this year and who can complete a 1.5km race. These children need to have completed one morning training session to be assessed over that distance.

Please be advised that children must be turning 10 this year or older (11 and 12 years) to compete at the Lytton District trials. To compete at Districts, children will need to be able to run the whole 2km or 3km distance without walking.

#### What to wear on the day

On the day children are to wear their full sports uniform and may bring house colour shirt/ribbons etc. to wear when they are running. Children will need to bring hats and water bottles to the Valley when it is time for their race. Please ensure your child applies sunscreen before coming to school.

#### The schedule has been modified slightly and will run as follows:

Please be advised that this schedule is subject to change due to potential unforeseen complications on the day.

Awards: Children in Prep will all receive a 'Well Done' ribbon. All other grades will be awarded 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> ribbons.
